The preschoolers started the week off searching for shapes around the room to Dr. Jean's I spy a shape and shape-a-loo songs. During circle time students have been going on a shape safari hunt and snapping pictures of different shapes and discussing the number of sides each shape has. On Thursday, during circle time, students discussed the different safety signs and learned why each one of them is important to prepare us for our shape and pedestrian safety walk.

In addition to circle time activities, on Monday, students continued to work on the writing of their first name. If you child already knows how to write his/her name we are working on forming the letters correctly. On Tuesday, students sorted shape stickers into their correct box.
